AILIS organized 13 events in 2006 of which 2 workshops and 1 professional visit that were particularly successful. The workshop programs are included in the annexes. The workshop on UN documentation, organized in May in collaboration with the UNOG library, has been attended by 21 participants.

The workshop on corporate blogging and RSS, organized in June in collaboration with the Geneva University has been attended by 29 participants for both sessions (English and French speaking).

13 AILIS members accompanied us on our professional visit of the Zurich University Library, with a very interesting program organized by Matthias Müller, former AILIS executive committee member.

Participation in the Library Science Talks is fluctuating but with an average of 20 participants, we may call ourselves quite satisfied. Membership is not requested for attending the Library Science Talks. However, more would be better and we have the impression that it is difficult to reach the “non AILIS” librarians in Geneva and surroundings. University participation needs to be encouraged and any suggestions to widen the fame of AILIS among librarians and information specialists in the broad Geneva area are welcome. AILIS still has too little individual members though we encourage participants in workshops, visits or training sessions to become member.

Attempts to set up a AILIS blog have not been very successful – our executive members are already very busy... but we hope that the project can be studied again in 2007. Any candidates who are willing to help us, please come forward.

AILIS will organize a professional visit to Lyon. A provisional and very promising program has been established in collaboration with Bertrand Calenge, Bibliothèque municipale de Lyon. A date needs to be fixed.

The AILIS luncheon program is still blank and every suggestion is welcome. We would like to mention that many organizations have interesting projects, not directly linked to library activities, but within the limits of information/content management or new technologies that affect our daily work. Staff involved in such projects may be invited as lunch contributors. We had a good example with Lara Srivastava from the Strategic and Policy Unit in ITU who spoke at our AILIS Christmas lunch in December 2006 and who made a fascinating talk. We therefore issue an appeal for luncheon proposals for 2007.
